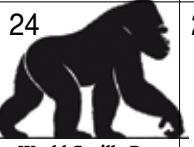

Art in the Park Returns to Hurricane Shoals Park September 19-20

Arts and crafts, live music, living history, family activities, Civil War skirmishes, Bluegrass Festival, Putt-Putt, Kids Zone, great food and the natural beauty of Hurricane Shoals come together September 19th and 20th for the 36th Art in the Park Festival at Hurricane Shoals Park.

Presented by the Tumbling Waters Society of Jackson County, the annual festival has become a favorite fall tradition, bringing visitors to one of Jackson County's most beautiful and historic settings for a weekend filled with something for just about everyone. The festival will be open Saturday, September 19th, and Sunday, September 20th, from 10 a.m. until 6 p.m.

A wide variety of artists, craftsmen and specialty vendors will fill the park, offering handmade and one-of-a-kind items. Visitors can spend the day browsing the booths, enjoying live entertainment, sampling festival food and taking in the scenery along the shoals.

Families will find plenty to keep younger festival-goers entertained, while history comes alive across the river in



the Heritage Village. Historic buildings preserved at Hurricane Shoals offer visitors a glimpse into life in an earlier Jackson County, with demonstrations and activities throughout the weekend.

One of the festival's most popular traditions is the historic Grist Mill, where corn is ground into cornmeal just as it was generations ago. The working mill is one of Hurricane Shoals Park's signature attractions and operates during Art in the Park each year. 🏠

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Chocolate Delight

2 small boxes of vanilla instant pudding
3 cups of cold milk
8 oz. cool whip
Graham crackers

Mix vanilla pudding and milk. Add 8 oz. cool whip to mixture. Layer graham crackers and pudding mixture in the bottom of 9 x 13 casserole dish. Put a layer of graham crackers on top.

Topping

1 cup sugar
1/3rd cup cocoa
¼ cup of milk
1 stick of butter
1 teaspoon of vanilla

Mix topping ingredients. Boil for 1 minute, let cool, then pour mixture over graham crackers. Let set overnight in refrigerator.



Squash Casserole

4 cups sliced yellow squash
½ cup chopped onion
¼ cup water, or more as needed
35 buttery round crackers, crushed
1 cup shredded Cheddar cheese
2 large eggs, beaten
¾ cup milk
¼ cup butter, melted
1 teaspoon salt
ground black pepper to taste
2 tablespoons butter

Preheat oven to 400 degrees and set aside a lightly greased 9 x 13 casserole dish. Cook squash and onion in water in skillet until tender. Drain. Mix cracker crumbs and cheese together in a separate bowl. Stir half of the cracker mixture into cooked squash mixture. Mix eggs and milk together in a small bowl, then add to squash mixture; stir in ¼ cup melted butter, and season with salt and pepper. Spread mixture into the prepared baking dish. Sprinkle with remaining cracker mixture, and dot with 2 tablespoons butter. Bake in the preheated oven until golden brown on top and set, about 25 minutes.



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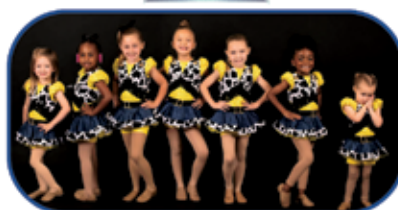
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The Food Takes the Cake!

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Plum's the Word!

Plum is everywhere right now, and not burgundy, nor dark wine color, nor the dusty rose color seen a few years ago. It's something darker and harder to name: like crushed velvet or light mulberry.

- ☐ Find and confirm ceremony music
- ☐ Order the bridesmaid dresses
- ☐ Start the wedding registry if you haven't already
- ☐ Confirm the rehearsal dinner

4-5 MONTHS BEFORE THE WEDDING

- ☐ If you're taking a honeymoon, start planning
- ☐ Investigate formal wear, get details, book it
- ☐ Figure out if you're doing a post-wedding brunch, start getting those details
- ☐ Order wedding favors
- ☐ Order wedding invitations
- ☐ Find and buy wedding bands
- ☐ Find any rental equipment you'll need

3 MONTHS BEFORE THE WEDDING

- ☐ Finalize Guest List
- ☐ Get updated addresses, confirm spellings
- ☐ You may want to create a spreadsheet to track wedding gifts
- ☐ Find all the other wedding helpers you may need such as Ushers/ Host or Hostess, and Ceremony helpers
- ☐ Perhaps a day-of wedding coordinator is a nice splurge at this point
- ☐ Mail invitations
- ☐ Find and book your hair and make-up
- ☐ Work with the host of the rehearsal dinner to coordinate

1-2 MONTHS AHEAD

- ☐ Work on your wedding vows (if not using traditional ones)
- ☐ Figure out any gifts you're giving to bridal party, parents, attendants, others
- ☐ Enjoy any bridal showers; get thank you notes done quickly!
- ☐ Confirm marriage license details

1-2 WEEKS BEFORE WEDDING

- ☐ Walk through the flow of the entire event
- ☐ Confirm seating chart if applicable
- ☐ Confirm all vendors

3-7 DAYS BEFORE THE WEDDING

- ☐ Make sure the men all have their formal wear (or details on when/where/how to pick it up)
- ☐ Confirm the rehearsal dinner details
- ☐ Pack for honeymoon and your day-of gear for the wedding
- ☐ Have all tips/payments in special envelopes for a trusted friend (often the best man) to deliver to the vendors on the wedding day

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
